Training the Next Generation of Health Professionals in Vermont

- Many students have participated in SVTAHEC's MedQuest Health Careers Exploration programing in high school
- ✓ SVTAHEC has recruited and placed over 70 students in healthcare-related internships since 2013
- Already 17 alumni have either gone on to health science-related graduate or medical school, or been hired by healthcare providers
- Exposing students to the challenges and rewards of providing quality healthcare in under-served rural communities
- Engaging students in real-life settings, where rural healthcare is being delivered by a team of professionals, drawing on resources available throughout the community

Improving Rural Health Access and Outcomes

High achieving healthscience undergrads engage in projects that benefit the host precepting organization, often addressing a community health need.

Organizations may engage in small discreet time-sensitive projects or more substantial longerterm initiatives that may take several years and draw on the participation of multiple interns. A sampling of past projects include the following:

- Researching and preparing grant applications for a prevention coalition's LGBTQ-related programming.
- Assisting a dental hygienist in delivering school-based oral health prevention services.
- Working with a community hospital to research and present on "Culturally Acquired Metabolic Disorder"



Professional Support for Students and Preceptors

- Students' work is paid for through foundation and donor support
- SVTAHEC provides orientation and on-going support to students throughout their internship, with opportunities to share and collaborate with peer interns in other communities
- Regular check-ins with host preceptors are provided; annual program evaluation and quality improvement conducted with each preceptor site
